

February: It was decided to form a committee to review/recommend improvements to the park. Profit from the 6/23 golf outing will be given to Camp Bear Lake. The 2012/2013 slate of officers was approved for presentation to the club. Parade Marshalls will be decided at the next regular meeting. Voted to add 1 non-board member to each ad-hoc committee that is formed for more member involvement. It was passed to purchase another dozen emblems for us on our projects.

March: Updates on the annual golf outing, our Bates Park project, and our scholarship projects were discussed. Nominations for King/Queen of this year's festival also were given. It was approved to purchase 50 Lions emblem decals for members to purchase for their vehicles.

April: Updates were provided on the 6/23 golf outing (help is still needed), our Bates Scout Park project, and others. In new business, Gary Benall from the city was there to request funding from us for new city signs showing club logos/meetings. New member Chris Starr was accepted, and there was a discussion concerning the reinstatement cost of members returning.

May: Many items were discussed and acted on at this meeting. PDG John Carroll gave an update on the upcoming golf outing (6 teams possibly 7 so far, more needed and help needed that day), a 4-on-4 soccer tournament will be held sometime in August at Bates Scout Park, the board purchased 15 iPad type (not IPads) electronic devices for K-2 grades at the school for \$2,200, charter night was set for



The 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of June (14<sup>th</sup>), place TBD, Lion Dave Purcel reported White Cane sales of \$2,012 and stressed that more help is needed from the club so a few aren't doing it all, Lion Larry Sparkes noted the festival brought in \$10,555 with the raffle making \$3,688 of that and the chicken dinner approximately bringing in \$1,200.

In new business the board donated \$1,000 to help 8 scouts attend a camporee. Also the Jack Clarkson Band has requested to play at our Christmas party this year gratis. A request to pay for a camper to attend Bear Lake was not acted on, the transfer of Lion Wendell McKeown to Grayling was approved, the purchase of a used charcoal cooker trailer was tabled for more information, and a request for a wheelchair ramp was also tabled for more information.
